RULES:

This competition will be conducted under the rules of U.S. Figure Skating as set forth in the 2009 Rule Book. The International Judging System (IJS) will be used for applicable events Juvenile through Senior¹. The IJS "Mini System" will be used.

ELIGIBILITY:

The competition is open to qualified amateur skaters who are members in good standing of U.S. Figure Skating. Skaters may compete in as many events as qualified by their test level as of August 7th, 2009, or at one level higher. Skaters must skate all Free Skating, Artistic Free Skating, and Compulsory/Short Program events at the same level. If there is more than one group at the level of Pre-Juvenile or above, the groups will be formed by random grouping, and all lower levels will be grouped according to age.

ENTRIES:

Entry fee will be \$90.00 for the first event and \$20.00 for each additional event. Make checks payable to the **Maplewood Figure Skating Club**. **Entries, along with the required fees, and a self-addressed, stamped business sized (No. 10) envelope must be postmarked (not metered) by August 7th, 2009.** Late entries will only be accepted at the discretion of the Maplewood Figure Skating Club. **A \$2 fee will be assessed if a No. 10, self-addressed envelope is NOT included with entry.** Address all entries and inquiries to:

Please note that your coach is required to sign your application form. Her/His signature verifies your level of competition and the events you are competing in. A Home Club officer signature is required to validate that you are in good club standing and to certify the information included on your form.

Event changes or additions to entries made after an application has been submitted may be assessed a \$25 change/add fee.

REFUNDS:

There will be no refunds after **August 14th, 2009**, unless your event is canceled by us for lack of participation.

REGISTRATION:

The registration desk at the St. Croix Valley Recreation Center will be open during all practice and competition sessions. **Competitors should arrive at the arena 45 minutes before the scheduled time of their event.** All schedules will be posted on an official bulletin board at the St. Croix Valley Recreation

Center. It is the responsibility of each competitor to check this board for official schedules and notices.

PRACTICE ICE:

There will be no official practice ice included in your registration fee. Practice ice will begin on Friday, September 25th, 2009. **Practice ice sign up information will be mailed with your competition schedule.** Practice ice will be available for purchase on Friday, September 25th, Saturday, September 26th and Sunday, September 27th.

CANCELLATIONS:

Any scheduled event may be canceled or combined if there are fewer than three entrants or if the Chief Referee determines that insufficient ice time is available to complete all events in an orderly manner. Skaters will be notified if their event is canceled or combined.

ADMISSION:

There will be no admission fee to the Maplewood Fall Classic. Refreshments will be available during the competition and practices at the St. Croix Valley Recreation Center

MUSIC:

Only CD's (standard compact disc format only) will be accepted. They should be clearly marked with the skater's name and event. CD's must contain only **one** track and be recorded on **CD-R** media (**no CD-RW's** due to compatibility problems). It is suggested that you have a duplicate CD available with you. You must turn your music in at the registration desk when you register, **NO EXCEPTIONS**. All care will be taken, but the Maplewood Figure Skating Club can assume no responsibility for the CDs. CDs will be returned to the registration desk after each event. CDs not collected prior to the end of the competition will only be returned at the participant's request and expense.

AWARDS:

There will be no final rounds. Trophies will be awarded to the top four skaters in each group for Well Balanced and Competitive Test Track Free Skating. Medals will be awarded to the top four skaters in each group for Compulsory, Short Program, Artistic, Interpretive, Spins and Jumps. The top four skaters in the Beginner and Pre Preliminary Compulsory and Free Skating events will be given awards as above, and participation medals will be given to all other participants in the group. The participation medals may be picked up at the awards desk. Trophies and medals will be presented off-ice after results for each event are posted. The awards desk is located next to the photographer.

VIDEOTAPING AND PICTURES:

Videotape of the individual competitor's performance will be available. An official photographer will be present to take event and individual awards pictures.

SPECIAL NOTE:

The Competition Committee and the Chief Referee reserve the right to separate combined Artistic Free Skating groups in order to keep fair group sizes. **Skaters may be required to skate more than one event on one day.**

TEST SESSION:

Singles and Dance testing will be available on Thursday, September 24th, 2009 at the St. Croix Valley Recreation Center. This test session will be conducted by the Maplewood Figure Skating Club. If you would like to test on September 24th, please complete the attached test session application and postmark it by September 4, 2009.

LOST AND FOUND:

IJS EVENTS:

We will be using IJS for all Well Balanced Free Skate and Short Program events Juvenile through Senior. We will also be using the IJS "Mini" System for these events.

All other events will use the 6.0 system.

Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior skaters competing in Well Balanced Free skating events must submit their planned program content at www.usfsaonline.org.

Judges will provide critiques for all skaters competing in IJS events **at no charge**. Please let the registration desk know when you check in if you would like a critique of your Well Balanced Free Skate or Short Program. Critiques will generally be provided immediately after the event, or as soon as possible thereafter.

COMPETITIVE TEST TRACK FREE SKATING

We are offering Competitive Test Track Free Skating for levels Pre-Preliminary through Intermediate. Skaters may enter EITHER the Test Track Free Skate program OR the Well Balanced Track Free Skate program but NOT both during the competition. Competitors will skate to music of their choice. Deductions WILL be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description:

- 0.1 from EACH mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description.
- 0.2 from the technical mark for each extra or lacking element.
- 0.1 for any spin with less than required revolutions.

Skaters must not have passed tests higher than the level at which they are competing. (Note: Open Pre-Juvenile and Open Juvenile skaters skating competitive test track events will skate in the Pre-Juvenile or Juvenile levels of this event, but they may skate other events (Compulsory, Spins, Jumps, Artistic, Interpretive) at the Open levels.

COMPULSORY / SHORT PROGRAM

Skaters must compete at the same level as their well balanced or competitive test track free skating event. This event will be conducted according to the rules passed at the 2009 Governing Council. No music will be used in compulsory events, with the exception of "Short Program" events for Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior. Programs may be shorter than the time shown, but may not exceed it. Double jumps may not be substituted for single jumps. An Axel is considered a single jump. Combination jumps may not have a change of foot in between (see Rule Book). Compulsory elements may be done in any order. Deductions will be taken for any missing elements, added elements, and interruptions in the flow of the program. Repeating moves other than moves which would normally be considered connecting steps will be penalized.

NOTE: Timing for compulsory program will start with any kind of movement of the body.

ARTISTIC FREE SKATING

Artistic feeling and presentation are stressed more than the technical difficulty in these events. Vocal/Instrumental music of the skater's choice is used. Show costumes are permitted, however, props are not allowed. Judging will be based on originality, creativity, and musical interpretation. Eligibility by test level is the same as for free skating events. Skaters must compete at the same level as other free skating and/or compulsory events, **with the exception that** Limited Beginner and Beginner may skate up to the Pre-Preliminary Level. The competition committee or referee reserves the right to separate combined groups listed below in order to keep fair group sizes. Half jumps do not count toward the jump total.

NOTE: Timing for the artistic program will start with any kind of movement of the body. The program may be shorter than time shown, but may not exceed it.

INTERPRETIVE SHOWCASE/ IMPROVISATION

Skaters must skate at the same level as their Free Skate

This event is a performance choreographed by the unaided contestant (NO COACHES OR PARENTS). All competitors in a group will use the same music. Performances will be judged for theatrical and artistic qualities, from an entertainment standpoint. Even though technical skating skill and difficulty will not be rewarded as such, skating must still be the major element of the performance and of sufficient quality to support the theatrical elements chosen. Jump difficulty is not rewarded in interpretive showcase. If jumps are included in your program they should be those that you can perform with style, flow and confidence. A total of 3 different single jumps are permissible. No Axels are permitted Beginner through Preliminary. Half jumps do not count toward the jump total. No combination jumps. No double jumps at any level. The competition committee or the referee reserves the right to separate combined groups listed below or combine levels in order to maintain equitable group sizes.

NOTE: Timing for the interpretive program will start with any kind of movement of the body. The program may be shorter than time shown, but may not exceed it.

The Interpretive events will be conducted as follows:

1. Competitors will warm up together, and when asked to clear the ice, all competitors except the first skater will be led to an area away from view and out of earshot of the competition ice.
2. The first skater will hear the music again.
3. When the music finishes, the second skater will be led to an area where they can hear the music, but not see the ice. The first skater will then skate their program.
4. When the second skater takes the ice, the third skater will be led to an area where they can hear the music but not see the ice, and so on.

The above procedure ensures that all skaters hear the music the same number of times, and no skater will see any other skater's performance until they have already skated their program.

SPINS

Spins shall be skated in a SIMPLE PROGRAM with no extra or repeated elements. Age and test requirements are the same as listed under Free Skate. All levels are skated on one half of the ice surface. No music. Spins must be skated exactly as stated but may be skated in any order. Connecting steps may be used, but excessive moves will be penalized.

JUMPS

Age and test requirements are the same as listed under Free Skate. No Test through Pre-Juvenile, and Adults will be skated on one-half of the ice surface. All other levels will skate on full ice. No music. Jumps must be skated exactly as stated. Solo jump required may not be repeated in combination. Skater should only execute a second attempt of the chosen jump if dissatisfied with the first attempt. If a second jump is executed, it will be the one judged.

Time: 1 minute maximum except Novice, Junior, and Senior will be 1.5 minutes
